



Reporting of Suspected Child Abuse or Neglect

It is the policy of the Robert Frost Charter School to comply with the requirements of RSA169-C in reporting suspected child abuse and neglect. Further, it is our policy to cooperate with the New Hampshire Division for Children, Youth and Families (DCYF) and law enforcement agencies during investigations into alleged child abuse or neglect as outlined in RSA 169-C.

If a school employee suspects that a child has been abused or neglected, he/she will make a report immediately to DCYF. The Head of School will be notified that a report has been filed. The employee may request assistance from school staff.

Procedures for Reporting of Suspected Child Abuse or Neglect

It is the responsibility of Head of School to advise all school personnel of state law regarding reporting of cases of suspected abuse or neglect. This will be conducted annually.

An oral report shall be made immediately to DCYF by telephone and followed within 48 hours by a report in writing, if so requested by DCYF. Each report shall, if known, contain the name and address of the child(ren) suspected of being neglected and abused; the name of the parent or caregiver responsible for the child's welfare; the specific information and/or observations indicating neglect or the nature and extent of the child's injuries; the identity of the person(s) suspected of being responsible for such abuse and neglect; and any other information that might be helpful in the investigation or that may be required by DCYF.

Annual staff training regarding the reporting of child abuse and neglect is recommended annually.
